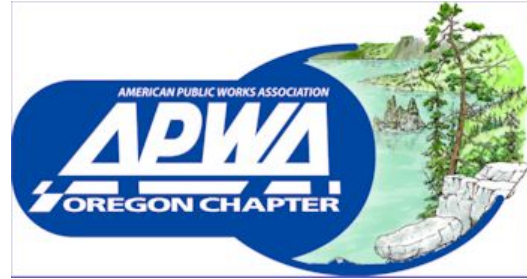


The Julian Prizes

Oregon Chapter APWA Awards for Sustainability

The Julian prizes recognize individuals, practices or project(s) that showcase the role of public works in furthering the principles of sustainability. The prizes are intended to recognize systems thinking, long term design practices, and infrastructure systems that sustain society. The prizes are intended to further APWA's purpose of education and recognition of excellence.

Nominees: Any person, team, or organization from public, private, or nonprofit sectors.

Criteria: Applications will be evaluated and receive points for the following categories:

- Economy
 - Wealth Creation
 - Entrepreneurialism
 - Financial Stability
- Community
 - Education
 - Safety
 - Enjoyment
 - Livability
- Environment
 - Pollution prevention or cleanup
 - Natural resource use and conservation
 - Energy Efficiency

Awards: Up to 4 Grand Prizes will be given in the following categories:

- Agency wide policies,
- Operating practices, procedures or programs,
- Projects or facilities,
- An individual's long term work effort to promote sustainability.

Grand Prizes may be awarded in each of these four categories to the nominee whose submittal is judged the best based on the above criteria.

Prize winners will be selected by the Oregon APWA Futures Committee. Prizes will be awarded on the evening of October 23, 2008, during the Oregon Chapter Fall Conference Banquet in Welches, Oregon.
