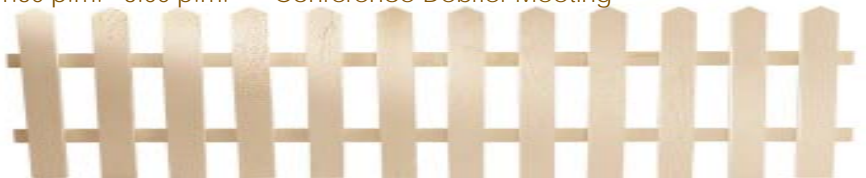

## *Speakers*

Tim O'Byrne is the Keynote Speaker for the Wednesday Opening Session Luncheon. Tim has worked hard over the years to establish long-term relationships with key industry people responsible for improving and safeguarding livestock production. After many years working in the cattle industry, Tim decided to set up his own consulting company in Alberta dealing specifically with training programs for feedlot personnel. He now lives in Las Vegas, Nevada and is the editor for Working Ranch magazine.

Tim's first book, "Cowboys and Dog Tales", was published by Caitlin Press and distributed in Canada by Harbour Publishing in 1997. He has authored over 60 articles published in Canadian Cattlemen magazine. In 2000, Tim began to write ranch-related articles for Western Horseman magazine, based in Colorado. In addition Tim has written many technical manuals and video scripts that deal with humane transportation and handling of livestock. His book, "Cowboys & Buckaroos" provides a description of the cowboy life along with horse and cattle handling.

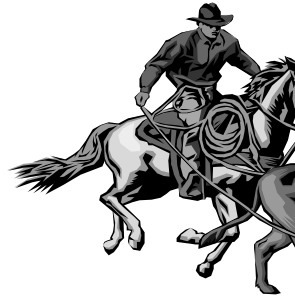
### *Evening Entertainment - Ropin' and Shootin'*

### ***High Desert Museum Tour/Lunch in Café at the Museum/Volcano Tour (Newberry Caldera)***

This all-day package, including transportation, provides a guide who will share fun information on the natural and cultural history of the area as you arrive at the nationally acclaimed High Desert Museum just south of Bend. You will be provided with a tour of the Spirit of the West which offers a walk-through-time exhibit of High Desert history that will set the stage for the rest of your museum visit. Time will allow to explore the Museum on your own, as well as take a stroll through the gift shop. The Museum attracts more than 100,000 paid visitors each year. Lunch will be "no host" at the Café at the Museum.

Following lunch break, the tour will continue farther south of Bend to the Newberry Caldera Crater. Here you will be standing in the bottom of an ancient volcano and able to explore the highlights within this volcanic caldera. At 6,300 feet you'll walk on a safe trail atop a mountain of black glass (valuable obsidian traded by the Native Americans) and hike the shores of sparkling Paulina Lake, through old growth hemlock forest and past a towering lava flow. The view is of three states and the morning's sun bathing the snow-covered Cascades. This journey is a combination of short, easy walks totaling just under two miles.

Guests are to meet at 9:00 am in the Waiting Area (adjacent to the Guest Registration Desk) for tour transportation.
