\$500 Civil Engineering Technology or Civil Engineering Transfer Scholarship

Umpqua Community College

The purpose of the scholarship is to recognize and financially assist Umpqua Community College students who are interested in pursuing a **career in civil engineering or in the field of Public Works**.

Eligibility

Full-time students who are enrolled in the Civil Engineering Technology or Civil Engineering Transfer program, and who have completed 45 credits at the beginning of the academic year of the award will be considered for the scholarship. Course work must be taken at Umpqua Community College. Women and minority students are encouraged to apply.

Selection Criteria

1. Must have completed the first three quarters of the Civil Engineering Technology or Civil Engineering Transfer program at the beginning of the academic year of the award with a grade point average of 3.0 or better.
2. Demonstrated financial need for the scholarship.
3. United States citizen.
4. Two-year resident of the state of Oregon.

Procedure

1. Applicant shall complete the Biographical Data Form provided by APWA, and deliver it to Clay Baumgartner, Umpqua CC coordinator for this scholarship, by May 14, 2010. **Be sure that your application includes the following information: academic achievement (GPA – attach transcripts), employment experience, student activities, community service, a statement of estimated income and expenses for the coming academic year, and a statement of your long term education and career goals.**
2. The Umpqua CC Civil Engineering Technology faculty shall review the applications and recommend one scholarship applicant to the APWA Scholarship Committee for consideration.
3. The recommended scholarship applicant, along with the requested supporting biographical data and transcripts, must be submitted to the APWA Scholarship Committee by May 28, 2010.
4. The APWA Scholarship Committee will then submit the scholarship application to the APWA Oregon Chapter Scholarship Foundation for consideration of award.
5. Applicants will be notified by August 13, 2010.
6. Half of the award will be disbursed at the beginning of the Fall Term and the other half at the beginning of Winter Term.

Return this form and attachments to Clay Baumgartner, Umpqua CC scholarship coordinator for this scholarship, by May 14, 2010.

A total of \$500 will be made available to the selected candidate. Half of the award will be disbursed at the beginning of the Fall Term and the other half at the beginning of the Winter Term.

The selected scholarship Recipient will be notified by August 13, 2010.

The scholarship recipient will be invited to be recognized at the Oregon Chapter APWA Fall Conference scheduled to be held at Pendleton, Oregon, October 12-15, 2010. **Registration fees, conference meals, and room accommodations will be provided for scholarship winners by the Chapter.** Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the conference.
